POW Write Up

Your POW should show how you think about a problem. It is more about explaining your process than just executing a procedure. The grade you receive will be largely impacted by how clearly you can explain yourself. Some of the grade will still be based on accuracy.

- Try to explain things so that someone who has never seen the problem would be able to understand why you did each step.
- Use pictures or diagrams to help explain things
- Type or neatly handwrite your report. (If I can't read it, I won't grade it)

The Write-up

Every POW requires you to explain your work in a written report.

Things to include:

- An introduction paragraph explaining the problem in your own words
- The **body** of the write will include how you solved the problem as well as any diagrams or math work that you need to include
- A **conclusion** summarizing the POW and your findings

Make it neat! Presentation matters and is part of the grade!

Things NOT to include:

- How long it took you to solve the problem
- Your personal feelings about how easy or hard the problem was
- Unrelated work on the same paper as your POW
